

Schwabe Symposium Proceedings

The yearly Schwabe Symposium is organized and sponsored by the Association for Veterinary Epidemiology and Preventive Medicine (AVEPM) to honor the lifetime achievement of individuals, nominated by their peers, who have made significant contributions in veterinary epidemiology and preventive medicine. The Symposium was named for its first awardee, Dr. Calvin W. Schwabe. Subsequent recipients of the Calvin W. Schwabe award were Drs. Robert K. Anderson (2004), James H. Steele (2005), S. Wayne Martin (2006), Clive C. Gay (2007), and David W. Hird (2008). The Symposium is held in conjunction with the annual Conference of Research Workers in Animal Diseases.

Papers presented at the Schwabe Symposium are intended to appeal to a broad audience, e.g., specialists and non-specialists, graduate students and working scientists. Rather than reporting on specific research projects, presenters are asked to review important trends and accomplishments in the discipline.
