

Canine osteosarcoma: a comparative model for evaluating cancer therapies

The tumor histology of appendicular osteosarcoma exhibits similar genetic and biologic characteristics in human beings and canines. Our group has investigated the participation of several receptor ligand pairs expressed on malignant osteoblast cells for their role in mitogenesis, angiogenesis, and cell survival. Through these studies, it is hoped that novel therapeutic targets may be identified, allowing for the more effective treatment of osteosarcoma in both canine and human cancer patients.
