Sea Creature Anatomy







Bony Fish

- Skeleton made of bone
- Have a gas bladder to help them float and sink

Sharks

- Skeleton made of cartilage, not bone
- No gas bladder, uses liver for buoyancy instead

- The top of the turtle shell is called the carapace and is made up of plates called scutes. Different species have different numbers of scutes!
- Unlike freshwater turtles and tortoises, sea turtles cannot retract their flippers and heads into their shells
- Sea turtles have salt glands behind their eyes to excrete excess salt from their bodies. When out of water, this makes it look like they are crying!

 - Choose alternatives to single-use plastics, like reusable bags, bottles, and straws
