Cows are pregnant for 9 months.

While cows are much larger than humans, they have the same gestation/pregnancy length.

Trivia Question #2

What is the average weight of a newborn foal?

A. 75 lbs B. 100 lbs C. 125 lbs D. 150 lbs





On average a foal at birth will weight approximately 10% of their mothers weight.

The average mare weights approx. 1,000 lbs making the foal average weight 100lbs.

B is the correct answer.

Trivia Question #3

What is the term for an infant bat?

A. Pup B. Cria C. Kit D. Cub





The correct answer is A.

A newborn bat is referred to as a pup.

Bats give birth to one baby and the baby survives on its milk for the beginning stages of its life, like other mammals.

Trivia Question #4

Which animal species normally goes through a 'fake pregnancy' for a few weeks 1-2 times per year even if they are not actually pregnant?

A. panda

B. fox

C. dog

D. hamster

Answer #4

The correct answer is C!

Dogs go through a pseudopregnancy or fake pregnancy a couple times a year. During this time, even though they are not pregnant, they may experience signs of pregnancy such as vomiting, milk production, lethargy, nesting behaviors, and increased water retention. This lasts for up to 3 weeks.

1. Myth or Fact?



The male seahorse can give birth to more than 1,000 baby seahorses

Fact!

The female seahorse gives the male her eggs and the male keeps them in his pouch for 20 days before giving birth.



2. Myth or Fact

Horses, in the wild, only breed during the winter months.



Myth!

Horses are known to only breed in the summer months, so the foals are born in the spring or early summer. This is so there is more food available for the mother to graze in order to produce milk for the baby.

3. Myth or Fact

In order for cows to produce milk they must give

birth to a calf.



Fact!

Cows will start to produce milk at the end of their pregnancy due to different hormonal signals within their body. In order to keep producing milk they must give birth to a new calf each year.



4. Myth or Fact

Sheep and goats typically only have one baby each year.



Myth!!

Sheep and goats are actually more likely to have twins than they are to have a single baby. Triplets are also fairly common.
